Times and Places: As of June 27th, the Afterschool program will transform into the School Age Summer Program, operating from **7:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.**

So that the summer goes as smoothly and safely as possible, please observe the following guidelines:

- 1) All children must be here by 9:00 a.m., and picked up by 6:30 p.m. Please check the schedule for departure times on Field Trip days, **SOME OF THE TRIPS MAY BE SCHEDULED TO LEAVE BEFORE 9:00 AM.** If your child misses the bus, (S)He will not be able to attend the center that day.
- 2) You are **REQUIRED** to walk your child to the back door labeled School Age every morning and evening to sign them in and out as well as scanning the QR code on the Brightwheel app, please fill out the health check prior to dropping off your child.
- 3) If your child will not be attending for the day, or if someone different will be picking up your child/ren, you must call to let us know. (914-241-2135) or you can send us a message on Brightwheel.
- 4) Children should wear sneakers and socks each day, or at least bring them. Sandals/flip flops/crocs are a tripping hazard on the playground.
- 5) Due to strict licensing regulations, children are not allowed to engage in screen time activities while at the center. Please do not send electronic equipment/cell phones/Apple watches to the center. **The Center will NOT be responsible if they are lost or damaged if they are sent in.**
- 6) If you ever need to contact me (Stacey Ford), you can email me at sford@mkccc.org. I will send out reminders by email or Brightwheel. If you need to speak to me during the day you can call the center at 241-2135. You may also send a message on the Brightwheel app.
- 7) **Please send in a refillable water bottle every day and take home to clean every night (water only)**
- 8) Coppertone SPF 50 sunscreen is provided as well as Off Bug Spray, please sign the form for your child to have sunscreen applied as well as bug spray. If you want something other than what we provide you must send it in for your child. (label it with their name)

- This form should NOT be used to meet the consent requirements for the administration of the following: prescription medications, oral over-the-counter medications, medicated patches, and eye, ear, or nasal drops or sprays. OCFS Form 7002 would meet the consent requirements for medications.
- One form must be completed for each over-the-counter product. Multiple products cannot be listed on one form.
- This form must be completed in a language in which the staff is literate.
- If parent's instructions differ from the instructions on the product's packaging, permission must be received from a health care provider or licensed authorized prescriber.

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Dear Families,

Welcome to our Mount Kisco Child Care Center summer camp! We are looking forward to a great season!

We want to be sure that we are all clear about our exclusion policies.

If your child is not feeling well and displaying any symptoms of Covid, we ask that you give them a COVID test. If the test is negative, they may return to the Center once they are symptom free for 24 hours without medication. We ask that you test them again on day 5.

If your child tests positive for Covid, they must remain out of the Center for at least 5 days.

- a. If they are showing any symptoms, they may not return until they are symptom free for 24 hours without medication, and no sooner than day 6
- b. If they are not showing symptoms, they may return to the Center on Day 6
- c. Children who have tested positive must wear a mask on days 6-10 throughout the day while indoors as much as feasible.

Calculating Days:

Day 0 is the day that your child tests positive or develops symptoms.

Day 1 is the first full day after the test or the symptoms begin.

We will notify all families if there is a positive case in the summer camp and we will inform you if your child has had a close contact. You will not be required to quarantine due to an exposure. We ask that you watch your children carefully for any symptoms and notify us immediately if they do develop symptoms or test positive.

If your child has been in close contact with the positive child, we will ask them to wear a mask until day 10 as much as is feasible and we will ask you to give your child a Covid test on Day 5. If you need a covid test, we will provide one for you.

Please know that this policy is only for school age, summer campers.

Infants, toddlers and preschoolers will continue to follow the OCFs guidelines that have been shared with families earlier this year.

Children in those programs who are exposed must be excluded and quarantine for 5 days and may return to the Center on Day 6 if there are no symptoms and there is a negative test. They will be required to wear a mask on days 6-10.

If any child is vaccinated or has had covid in the past 90 days, no exclusion will be required.
