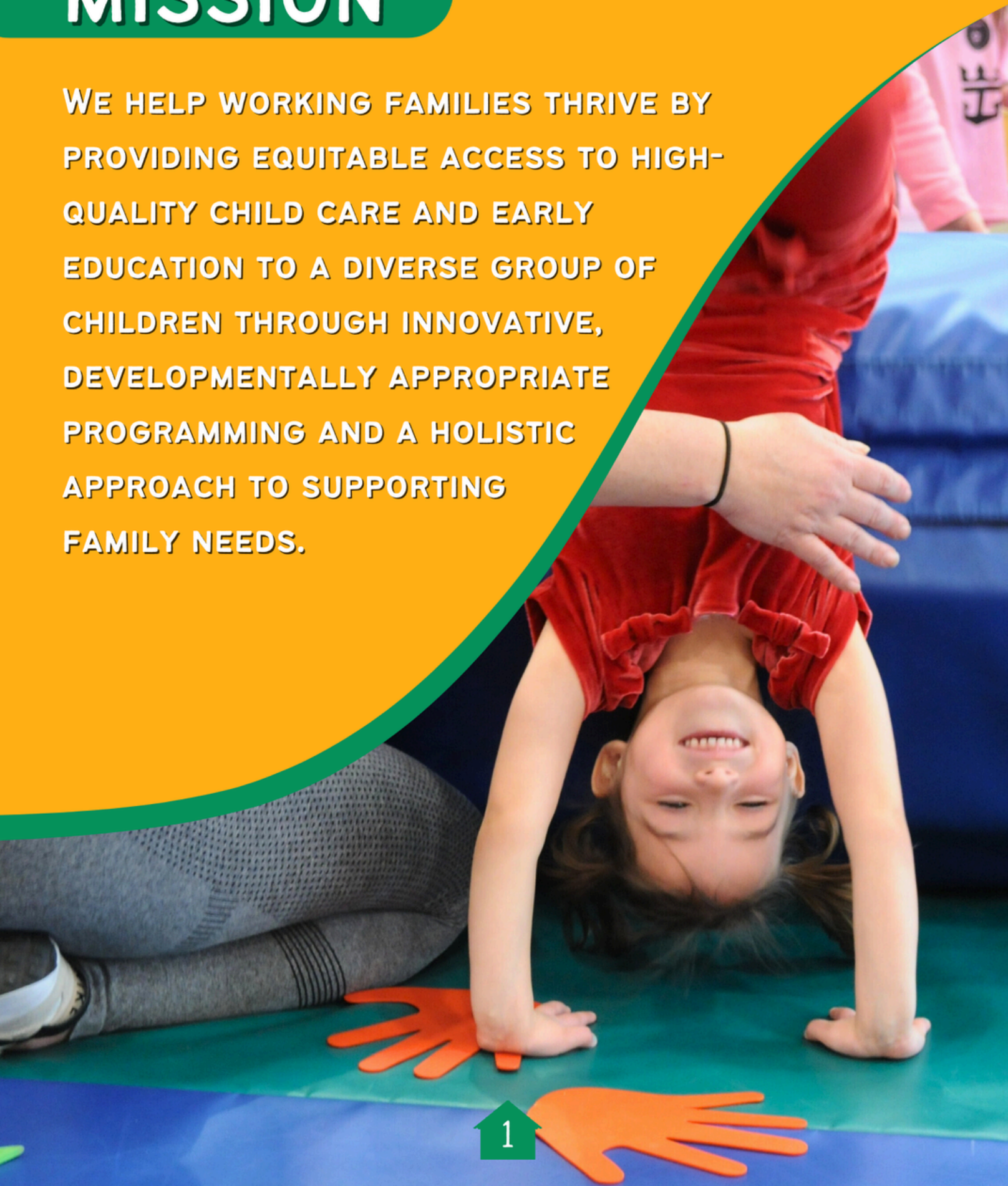

FINANCIALS

In 2024-2025, MKCCC remained dedicated to supporting a diverse group of local working families by providing high-quality, reliable child care and early education, regardless of income. Ensuring that MKCCC classrooms reflect the diversity of our community is a key part of our commitment to equitable care. For families who cannot afford full tuition, MKCCC offers scholarships and helps eligible families access government subsidy support. Thanks to successful advocacy efforts and our work in supporting family applications, government subsidy funding increased in fiscal year 2024-2025.

However, the statewide elimination of workforce retention grants posed a significant challenge to keep up with rising compensation costs driven by increases in minimum wage and employee health care. Despite these challenges, MKCCC remains committed to offering affordable, high-quality care to all families, while continuing to advocate for the resources needed to sustain our mission and the child care industry.

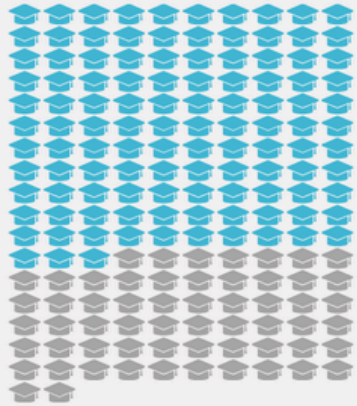

WHY IT MATTERS

Child care for families of any income level-- but most especially low and moderate income levels-- has never been more scarce. Since the pandemic, New York's child care workforce has shrunk by 42%, resulting in centers with empty classrooms, overflowing waitlists, and staff that is overworked and undercompensated. Many centers have had to close altogether, furthering the burden on centers that are barely staying afloat. Coupled with the skyrocketing inflation rate, raising the cost of living as well as the cost of care, families that are able to find child care still face the challenge of affording it. The need for accessible, affordable, high quality care for all is greater than ever.

Since 1971, MKCCC scholarships have provided an avenue to high quality child care and early education to families who would not otherwise have access to it. Every day at MKCCC, children of all backgrounds, abilities, and socio-economic statuses come together to learn and grow, from both our incredible teaching staff and from each other. MKCCC works to bridge the gap between families who are able to afford the rising cost of child care and those who cannot, while also providing care that considers the individual needs of each child for the most nurturing care possible. This includes actively advocating for child care legislation, providing in-house guidance and support, and partnering with local schools and organizations in order to provide special services. MKCCC works tirelessly so that our families know that their children are in a place dedicated to meeting each child's individual needs and celebrates all of their successes.



'24-25 HIGHLIGHTS



CELEBRATING 150 YEARS

MKCCC joined in on the party to celebrate Mount Kisco's 150th Anniversary! An MKCCC contingent, from board members to alumni to current families, decked out in MKCCC shirts, carried the banner and marched in the sesquicentennial parade this past June.



HALLOWEEN AT MKCCC

In 2024, our friends at Kohlberg & Co. generously ran a candy and costume drive for MKCCC, providing dozens of costumes for families who might not be able to afford new costumes, as well as bags upon bags of candy to sustain the horde of excited trick or treaters at Trunk or Treat!

In April, our new friends from Westchester's newest professional team, Westchester Soccer Club, spent a morning on the turf at MKCCC! Five players and the WSC coach dropped by the Center to teach our preschool students some new skills and tricks, like blocking and scoring. The players then took on the school age group in a surprise game of approximately 5 against 30. The gross motor room was filled with warmth and laughter as our students were joined by their parents and siblings for a hearty breakfast! Tables and walls were adorned with festive crafts created by our students, which they eagerly showed off to their families. Local politicians such as Legislator Erika Pierce, County Executive Ken Jenkins, and Legislator Vedat Gashi were kind enough to join us, celebrating a successful year in child care advocacy. To top off the affair, Mr. Cusati, our music teacher, join us at our preschool breakfast to lead everyone in a sing along!

PROGRAMS



Mount Kisco Child Care Center provides child care and early education for ages 3 months to 11 years. At MKCCC we go well beyond the traditional requirements — our programs and tools help teachers create individualized learning and care plans for every child. Progress and updates are available each day for families to ensure home / school continuity is in place for our little learners.

INFANTS

In our infant rooms, we create a warm, nurturing environment that acts as an extension of our infants' homes. Infants are provided with daily opportunities that encourage social and emotional development, speech and language, cognitive growth, and fine and gross motor development through group and independent activities. We even use basic American Sign Language to provide avenues of communication to our youngest children.

TODDLERS

Toddlers love to explore the world around them. The toddler rooms are designed to allow children to use all of their senses to learn and grow. Toddlers are engaged in activities and experiences designed to meet their emerging skills in language, socialization and personal autonomy. In addition, the toddlers have their own playground, a place where they can run, jump, climb, and develop those large motor skills as well.

PRE-SCHOOL

Our preschool is a mixed 3, 4, and 5 year- old age group. We think it makes sense to teach children developmentally rather than chronologically. Each child comes in with different experiences and skill sets. Lesson plans are written to prepare children for Kindergarten in ways that are play based and developmentally appropriate. We use the Creative Curriculum, which is a child-initiated curriculum. Children learn best when they are learning about the things that they are interested in. Lesson plans cover all content areas necessary for school success; literacy, math, science, and social studies.

SCHOOL AGE

Our school age program consists of our before and after school programs. Both programs provide a place where students can get homework help and prepare for or unwind from the day while they socialize with friends and play games. This program also takes part in diverse, engaging programming such as Feed Me Fresh where they maintain their class gardens and utilize recipes to prepare fun and healthy snacks.

SUMMER CAMP

MKCCC offers a full-day, 8 week summer camp program for Kindergarten through 5th grade. Every day is a new day filled with fun in the sun while also focusing on each child's development. We provide a variety of programming that every child can find an interest in from karate, dance classes, and daily trips to the local pool, to STEM endeavors like roller coaster and robot building. The Feed Me Fresh program thrives during summer camp, with new garden projects every day. Our camper-run farm stand teaches campers how to manage a farm stand, advertise, and the importance of supporting their community when they donate their profits to a local organization of their choice at the end of the summer.

IN-CLASSROOM PROGRAMS

PROVIDING GARDEN EDUCATION FOR MORE THAN 20 YEARS

Developed in consultation with nutritionists, teachers, local farmers, and chefs, Feed Me Fresh (FMF) is an innovative, year round, garden-to-table food service and nutrition education program. FMF pairs hands-on gardening units with cooking classes based on seasonal offerings from our playground garden beds, and includes healthy meals and snacks from our in-house FMF Food Service team. Each year, close to 200 MKCCC children learn about healthy eating through exposure to fresh foods they get to grow themselves. The program provides nutrient dense food some families might otherwise not have access to. In addition, it builds life-long healthy eating habits for all the children at MKCCC.

2024-25 saw our Feed Me Fresh gardens thriving more than ever! With the introduction of more playground garden beds, our avid student gardeners were able to introduce new crops to the gardens like snap peas, gourds, and watermelons. The number of beds also meant that classes could experiment with different gardening methods, with some beds utilizing careful plotting and sectioning while others were introduced to the "chaos" gardening method, where seeds and plantings are scattered at random to see what thrives. With such success, we can't wait to see what will be possible in 2025-26!



STEM AT MKCCC

Thanks to funding from Assemblymember Chris Burdick, in September 2024, MKCCC introduced integrated STEM programming into our Preschool classrooms. In partnership with The STEM Alliance, we developed engaging experiential activities for our young learners emphasizing skills like prediction, observation, and measurement. In addition to funding the programming, this grant allowed The STEM Alliance to provide professional development for our staff to further their knowledge of STEM pedagogy and ensure the sustainability of the program. Our summer campers got to experience their own curriculum, thanks to our gracious friends at Curtis Instruments, who visited weekly through the summer with new, dynamic experiments for campers to perform, learning about cause and effect, forming and testing a hypothesis, and more.

HONORING GREAT FRIENDS



SABIN STREETER

With great sadness we announce the death of Sabin Chase Streeter, age 84, of Chappaqua, New York on Sunday, September 28. We are comforted by the wonderful example of his long and fulfilling life.

Born in Hartford in 1941, Sabin grew up in Bloomfield, Connecticut. He spent summers at Camp O-AT-KA in Lake Sebago, Maine where he developed his skills and passion for baseball. A graduate of Deerfield Academy, he attended Middlebury College and served as a trustee from 1984 to 1989. He was instrumental in encouraging the College to adopt the Posse program and dramatically increase the diversity of its student body.

Sabin served in the U.S. Army Signal Corps from 1964 to 1966 at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. In the summer of 1961 he met Beverley Hamilton, the great love of his life. They were married in 1964 and in 1966 they moved to New York City, where Sabin attended Columbia Business School.

After graduation, Sabin joined the investment banking division of Blyth, Eastman Dillon. He moved to Dean Witter in 1972 and then joined Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette in 1976 as a senior vice president. Sabin made his most enduring legacy at DLJ. He was passionate about creating and sustaining the positive culture of the firm he loved.

In 1992, Sabin was named an executive-in-residence at Columbia Business School, where he taught and advised students for more than two decades. He also served on Columbia's Board of Overseers and then as a Trustee Emeritus. In 2014, he was awarded the Alumni Medal for Distinguished Service by the University. Throughout his career, Sabin was a forceful advocate for women in investment banking and for greater diversity both in higher education and on Wall Street. His most lasting professional and personal legacy is the mentoring and inspirational support that he gave at DLJ, at SEO (Sponsor for Educational Opportunity), and as an Executive-in-Residence at Columbia Business School.

A resident of Chappaqua for more than 50 years, Sabin served as Treasurer and Head of Ushers for many years at the family's beloved Church of St. Mary the Virgin. He coached all his sons' baseball teams with boundless enthusiasm and served on many boards and local organizations.

It is hard to overstate the magnitude of Sabin's impact on the lives of his family and friends. He had so much exuberant positive energy for all the things he did.

Sabin is survived by his wife Beverley; his three sons Sabin Jr., Gordon and George Streeter; his three daughters-in-law Krista Whetstone, Rebecca Streeter (Petrush) and Kristina Howard, his five grandchildren Otis, Hazel, Cornelia, and Delphine Streeter, and Nathaniel Appelt; and his two sisters Anita Smith and Alice Brooks.

MKCCC'S LEGACY PROGRAM
